From Our Pastor

This is the time of year when some focus more on their "love life". We begin to evaluate whether we are measuring up or not in our expressions of love to others. We ask ourselves certain questions. Am I doing a good job expressing true heart-felt love? What is the definition of heart-felt love? How do I visibly show true love? Why do I struggle in opening up my heart to others? All of these questions arouse legitimate concerns in our lives and each of us should ponder these concerns. Do we ever stop to evaluate who we should be expressing love to? Most of the time, our emphasis is on our relationship to people instead of the Lord. The first and greatest commandment is to "love the Lord thy God with all your heart, mind and soul." This means that He should be the recipient of the "best that I have to give" when it comes to expressing love.

In Revelation 2, we find a description of the church of Ephesus. At one time this church expressed great enthusiasm in their love relationship with Christ. Jesus was the main priority in their lives and He received the most attention. All of their efforts were directed to proving out what they felt in their hearts, but something changed their focus. A decline had started in their hearts that they were not even aware of. Their devotion had turned to duty, their loyalty and allegiance had changed, their hearts had grown cold and Jesus was no longer a priority. They were going through the motions. From the outside it was pretty impressive, however, Jesus knew that in their hearts there was a difference.

I often have to ask myself, "What is my motivation for trying to express love to others and the Lord?" What is the depth of my love? How far am I willing to go to prove my love? Am I only doing what I do to reap a greater return or am I truly concerned of letting someone know that I really love them with a Godlike love that is unconditional, selfless and sacrificial?

Jesus knew they were only giving lip service to the cause and He challenged them to take a long look at their hearts. First of all, Jesus asked them to stop and remember what their love was like when they first fell in love with Him. Do you remember those days? You could not do enough to please the heart of God. All you wanted to do is to bring pleasure to His heart. Whatever He asked you to do you would gladly do it even if it cost you something. There was sweet communion and rich times of fellowship between you and HIM.

Secondly, Jesus said not only to remember but repent. He was asking them to do an about face and get themselves back where they once were. Repentance is the admission that the fault is ours and we feel sorry for it. It is realigning ourselves with God and cooperating with the Holy Spirit to return to where we need to be.

Thirdly, Jesus required them to return. No man needs to stay where he is. The proof of repentance is a changed life. It is a willingness on our part to get back to doing the things that we did in the early days of salvation when our love for Jesus was so fresh and vibrant.

This past week at the Men's Prayer Advance, David Gibbs preached on, "How is your love life?" He made a statement that really challenged me. He said, "There is no such thing as a good Christian that has a bad love life." It is our responsibility to cultivate and maintain a strong relationship with Christ and to show our love to Him. Our chief responsibility is to live a life that proves out our great love for the Lord Jesus. So "how is your love life?"



these precious children and their parents. We look forward to watching these beautiful children and their parents grow and learn here at Hollywood!




On January 29, Miss Lillian celebrated her 100th birthday!



From Our Associate Pastor of Youth and Music

"We are called to be God's people, showing by our lives His grace; We are called to be God's servants, working in His world today."

So goes the old hymn. We throw that word around a lot: called. God calls us to salvation. God calls us to service. And eventually, God calls us home. But what exactly does that mean?

Paul began many of his letters by stating that he had been called by God, to be an apostle and to serve Him. He waxes eloquent about the calling that each and every Christian receives from God. There are various roles for our calling apart from salvation. But what do we do with that call?

1. We can run from God's call

Everyone knows the story of Jonah. God called him to evangelize the Ninevites. Instead, he got on a slow boat in the completely opposite direction. After a few days and nights in the belly of a great fish, he got back on the track that God intended for him to be on.

Our running tends to not be that dramatic, but it is still disobedience. We may not be called to evangelize an entire civilization. Our call may be to teach a class, witness to a family, sing in the choir...any number of things. But running is running, and the destination is out of God's will.

2. We can misinterpret God's call

Paul described himself as "set apart from birth." (Gal 1:15) He was an incredibly gifted theologian and scholar of the Jewish faith. God equipped him to understand and teach the deep things of His Word. Many times we think of Paul as a dirt-bag before he was converted, but the reality is he was serving God, as he understood it, as someone who was called.

It wasn't until the Damascus road experience that Paul realized his passion was mis-directed. He was persecuting the God he thought he was serving. He mis-interpreted the call that God had placed on his life. Fortunately, for Paul and for Christianity, God helped him to see the error of his ways and put him on the right path.

Sometimes we try to replace the actual call of God on our lives with a call that is "good enough." Maybe we are called to ministry, but we think serving as a Sunday School teacher will suffice. Maybe we are called to missions, but think that vocational ministry will get it done.

The fact is, God calls each of us to a specific role and purpose. We only feel the peace of God when we are in that purpose. To try and satiate the hunger to serve God with anything other than the meat of perfect obedience is futile.

3. We can accept God's call

At the end of the day we only find peace in obedience. God has not called everyone to be Billy Graham, but He has called everyone to a specific purpose and mission. We will not be satisfied until we answer that call with a resounding "yes!"

If God has called you to be a teacher, shine the light of Christ on the children with whom you come in contact. If God has called you to be a farmer, work the soil to the glory of God. If God has called you to any vocation, do it with all your might for God's glory. But if He has called you to something else, and you have not responded, I promise you your joy will not be complete until you do. Accept God's call.





