



#### From Our Associate Pastor of Youth and Music

I saw a meme on Facebook recently that gave me pause. Normally, even the most offensive things that catch my attention are relegated to non-important memory cells after a short period of time. This one, however, lingered. I couldn't get it out of my mind.

There was a picture of three women, meant to be observed from left to right. The left woman was pregnant; the middle woman was wearing a wedding dress; the right woman was walking away from the picture wearing a graduation cap. The caption read "Nothing wrong with doing things the opposite way, as long as you get the job done."

As Christians we have moved from, thou shalt not, to love the sinner but hate the sin, to judge not. And as the out-of-context application of these principles begat legalism, tolerance, and license, we have morphed into a body which is afraid to confront sin.

The simple fact is this...for believers, sin is never okay, never justified, and not to be ignored. It is certainly not something to be proud of, to flaunt for all of the world to see like it is no big deal. There are two particular fallacies that have gained popularity over the years that have contributed to our acceptance, and sometimes even glorification, of sin.

#### 1. All sin is the same.

When considering eternity, this statement is true; one sin, no matter how seemingly insignificant, is enough to disqualify a person from Heaven. That is why salvation by faith through grace is necessary. However, this equality of sin has been carried to an erroneous extreme.

How do we know that all sin is not equal? Because God says so. Throughout Exodus and Leviticus as God gave the Israelites the Law, He imposed harsher penalties on some sins than He did on others. Sin which resulted in the death or severe injury of man had the greatest repercussions because man is made in the image of God.

Even Christ assessed sin on a graduated scale. In Matthew 5:22, while addressing the fact that the root of sin is a heart matter, Jesus applies 3 different levels of resulting punishment for three different sins. He even referred to the sin of blasphemy of the Holy Spirit as the sin that "will not be forgiven." (Matt 12:31, CSB)

#### 2. Christians are not to judge others.

Next to Philippians 4:13, Matthew 7:1 is probably the Bible verse most often taken out of context. "Judge not" is the mantra of many people, believers and non-believers, who want to shut down those who would hold them accountable for their sin. Verse 4 even seems to indicate that those who have sin in their life have no business trying to correct someone else.

The problem is when we stop there. "First take the beam of wood out of your eye, and then you can see clearly to take the splinter out of your brother's eye." (Matt 7:5, CSB) Jesus goes on to instruct his followers to look out for...pass judgement on...false prophets. Paul instructs the church in Corinth to pronounce judgement on the believer who is practicing sexual immorality in 1 Corinthians 5. So what gives?

The command to not pass judgement on others carries a qualifier: when we are wrapped up in the same sin, we will be held to the same standard that we apply to them. So, to put it bluntly, we should not be hypocrites. We need to take care of that specific sin in our life before we try and help someone else.

But what about the adulterous woman? What about "The one without sin among you should be the first to throw a stone at her?" (John 8:7, CSB)

First, this was a set-up. The religious leaders were trying to present an impossible situation to trip Jesus up. Don't stone her and He rejects the Mosaic Law. Stone her and He goes against His teaching of love and forgiveness. Ask yourself...if the religious leaders were pious and upright, where was the man? The last time I checked it took two to commit adultery.

So, Jesus put the choice back on them; will you be a hypocrite, or will you walk away? And again, we have to look at the entirety of the passage. When He dismissed the woman, Jesus said "Go, and from now on do not sin anymore." (John 8:11, CSB) Even after saving her life, He did not ignore her sin.

Confronting sin is hard. We all feel like hypocrites when we do. There is a strong tendency toward tolerance and license (it's okay to sin because I am forgiven anyway) that we must overcome. Challenging someone with their sin leads to hard feelings and often damages relationships.

But God gave us the command in His Word to do just that...stand up to sin. There is a Godly method and manner in which to act, and there are enormous repercussions if we don't. When believers can flaunt their sinful actions in public like it is something to be celebrated, we need to sit up and take notice. If we do not lovingly but firmly challenge sin where we find it, we are ushering those we call brothers and sisters to a place no one wants to go.


